Model 50/100/600/700 Boards

Yellow Bird Planer Boards will run with the top half of the board out of the water at about a 35 degree angle with or without the flag.

Model 50 Boards

Yellow Bird Planer Boards with an adjustable pinch pad release and rear ball bearing release system. You can adjust the screw to either have the line pop out or stay on the release. Loosen the screw to have the line pop out of the front release and the board will slide down the line to a stop bead about 3' - 4' from the lure. Tighten the screw to keep the release attached to the line until board reaches the boat or the end of the fishing pole.

Model 100/600/700 Boards

Yellow Bird Planer Boards include the new XL Pinch Pad releases with an internal pin. These releases will keep your line attached until the board reaches the boat or the end of the fishing pole. This set up allows the board to travel in the water the way it's being trolled, so there is no resistence, dipping or diving from the board. It allows you to fight the fish not the board and the fish. This set up keeps your board from coming off your line and getting lost.
